# Why calendars?

---

- Practice & experiment with new skills and tools with a discrete endpoint in mind
- Out of wall space, not ready/no time for exhibiting or selling
- Explore different types of photography and subjects in a somewhat systematic way
- Selecting themes makes you review existing photos from new perspective (“My 5 Best” x 2.5 + 1)
- Allows narrative collections
- A way to share photographs with family and friends
- If a photo “doesn’t work”, only have to look at it for a month





# Structuring Calendar Collections

---

- Pick a theme, find a photo taken in the month shown
- Photos in order of year taken
- Use a narrative flow
- Random order
- Be creative



# Web Sites for Calendar Layout and Production

---

- Focused on quality of printing and paper, not necessarily most easy to use layout tools
  - Professional photo printing services, rather than cloud photo-sharing sites
- [adoramapix.com](https://www.adoramapix.com)
  - Good paper and print quality
  - Layout tools are a bit clunky but improving and offer design flexibility
  - Pre-made date grids and layout templates available, but can also build your own
  - Only square and (large) portrait format—no landscape format
- [nationsphotolab.com](https://www.nationsphotolab.com)
  - Reviews recommend for print quality
  - Landscape format, but templates appear to be less flexible for customization (?)
- [mpix.com](https://www.mpix.com)
  - Reviews recommend for high quality paper
  - Landscape format, but less customizable (?)
